The training will focus on an Introduction to Python and Technopreneurship: From Pitch to Prototype and will provide techniques and demonstrations for classroom implementation. Introduction to Python is a beginning course in which students can learn and practice coding in an online environment that requires only a modern Web browser and Internet access. Special software is not required. The course includes video content, practice labs, and coding projects and will include preparation for additional training that would focus on Python data structures such as strings, lists, and range sequences.

Technopreneurship is a course designed to teach students how to turn ideas into real products using design, coding, and business skills. Through the course, students will work in teams, experiencing different industry roles from project manager to developer. The course culminates in a final working technical prototype that teams will present to an audience of "investors."

There is no registration fee but preregistration is required. Participants are responsible for all meals, travel-related expenses, and lodging, if needed. This is an allowable Perkins expenditure if included in the approved local plan. Specific parking and school entry instructions, local dining, and other travel instructions will be sent following the completed registration.
