NOTIFICATION FOR ACCESSING PUBLIC BENEFITS OR INSURANCE

Upon receipt of parental consent, the local education agency (LEA) will submit claims to the Virginia Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS), (including the release information about your child's participation in services to participating physicians, other health care providers, DMAS, any DMAS billing agents, and any LEA billing agent as necessary, to process claims for reimbursement by DMAS) for covered health-related services, evaluations for these services and transportation, on the day the student receives any health related service which are outlined in the child's Individualized Education Program (IEP), including duration and frequency and/or evaluations for IEP services.

The LEA will access your or your child's public benefits or insurance to pay for services in your child's IEP.

With regard to services required to provide a free appropriate public education (FAPE) to your child, the LEA may not:

- Require you to sign up or enroll in public benefits or insurance programs in order for your child to receive FAPE.
- Require you to incur an out-of-pocket expense, such as the payment of a deductible or co-pay amount in filing a claim for services, although the LEA may pay the cost that you otherwise would be required to pay.
- Use your child's benefits if that use would (i) decrease available lifetime coverage
 or any other insured benefit; (ii) result in your family paying for services that
 would otherwise be covered by the public benefits or insurance program and that
 are required for your child outside of the time your child is in school; (iii) increase
 premiums or lead to the discontinuation of benefits or insurance; or (iv) risk loss
 of eligibility for home and community-based waivers, based on aggregate healthrelated expenditures.

You have the right to withdraw your consent to disclosure of your child's personally identifiable information to the parties listed above at any time.

Your withdrawal of consent or your refusal to provide consent to disclosure of your child's personally identifiable information to the parties listed above does not relieve the LEA of its responsibility to ensure that all required services are provided at no cost to you.
