SUBJECT: Request for Proposals for 21st Century Community Learning Centers

Competitive Grant Program for Community-Based Organizations

The Virginia Department of Education is pleased to announce the availability of 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) grant funds to be awarded to community-based organizations partnering with school divisions to support after-school, before-school, and summer learning programs to provide additional instructional opportunities to combat learning loss for school-age children attending high-poverty, low-performing schools. Funding for this program was appropriated by the Virginia General Assembly from the federal State and Local Recovery Fund (SLRF) pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 to supplement the 21st CCLC Program.

The Department will fund projects that provide significantly expanded learning opportunities for children and youth and will assist students in meeting or exceeding state and local standards in core academic subjects. Applicants eligible to submit a proposal for this competition are nonprofit agencies, city or county government agencies, faith-based organizations, and institutions of higher education.

Per the statute Section 4204(i)(1) of the Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965, as amended, grantees must serve schools that meet the absolute priority of serving students who attend:

- schools implementing comprehensive support and improvement activities (the lowest five percent of Title I schools, plus any high school with a federal graduation rate below 67 percent);
- schools implementing targeted support and improvement or additional targeted support and improvement activities (Title I and non-Title I schools, with lowperforming student groups);
- other schools determined by the local educational agency to be in need of intervention and support;
- schools enrolling students who may be at risk for academic failure, dropping out
  of school, involvement in criminal or delinquent activities, or who lack strong
  positive role models; and
- the families of such students.

Priority points will be given to those applicants that:

- propose to serve students in schools that either are a comprehensive support
  and improvement school, a targeted support and improvement school,
  additional targeted support and improvement school, and/or that are
  accredited with conditions;
- propose to serve students in middle or high schools; and/or
- propose to serve schools with a free and reduced price lunch eligibility of 75 percent or greater.

Applicants must consult extensively with parents, school division personnel, other community organizations, businesses, arts and cultural organizations, and other youth development agencies to develop 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC proposals.
