## SUBJECT: Information Letter to Parents of Rising Sixth-Grade Students

The 2007 General Assembly passed legislation that requires the Virginia Department of Health to provide parents/guardians of rising sixth-grade girls with information on the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and the Human Papillomavirus Vaccine. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that girls 11-12 years old receive the vaccine. In 2011, the CDC provided additional recommendation that boys 11-12 years old also receive the HPV vaccine.

The Virginia Department of Health makes electronic copies of the HPV letter to parents/guardians of rising sixth-grade students available in English and Spanish from the following website <a href="http://www.vdh.virginia.gov/immunization/requirements/">http://www.vdh.virginia.gov/immunization/requirements/</a>.

Effective April 1, 2017, the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) will no longer provide print copies of the HPV letter for distribution to parents/guardians. School divisions must print copies of the HPV letter or provide the link to the letter on their website, in the student handbook or during orientation.
