The Department shall establish the Virtual Learning Advisory Committee, which shall consist of one superintendent or his designee from each of the eight superintendent's regions, the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his designee, and such other members as the Department deems appropriate, not to exceed three additional members. The contractor that manages Virtual Virginia shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member.

§ 2.2-3708.3. (Effective September 1, 2022) Meetings held through electronic communication means; situations other than declared states of emergency.

- A. Public bodies are encouraged to (i) <u>provide public access, both in person and through electronic communication means, to public meetings</u>...
- B. Individual members of a public body may use remote participation instead of attending a public meeting in person if, in advance of the public meeting, the public body has adopted a policy as described in subsection D...
- B4. If participation by a member through electronic communication means is approved pursuant to this subsection, the public body holding the meeting shall record in its minutes the remote location from which the member participated...

- C1. An indication of whether the meeting will be an in-person or all-virtual public meeting is included in the required meeting notice...
- C5. A copy of the <u>proposed agenda and all agenda packets</u> and, unless exempt, all materials furnished to members of a public body <u>for a meeting is made available</u>...
- C9. The <u>public body does not convene an all-virtual public</u> meeting (i) more than two times per calendar year...

(POLICY DOCUMENT PROVIDED & ON FILE WITH VDOE)

ALL VIRTUAL BOARD MEETINGS AND ELECTRONIC PARTICIPATION IN BOARD MEETINGS GENERAL POLICY

I. PURPOSE

- The purpose of this policy is to establish a written policy, in accordance with §§ 2.2-3708.2 and 3708.3 of the Code of Virginia (Virginia Code) to allow for and govern participation of **Virtual Learning Advisory Committee (VLAC)** membership meetings by the means of electronic communication, including, all virtual meetings, and to specify the requirements for remote participation by members. The term Committee may be used synonymously with the term Board.
- This Policy was revised and updated August 2022 due to change in the law regarding all virtual meetings.

What is Virtual Virginia?

Throughout our 40-year history, the program that is today Virtual Virginia has made digital learning available to all learners in the Commonwealth with **no barriers to enrollment**—regardless of each student's academic history or geographic location.

For VVA, success is all about providing educational opportunities to all Virginia students and helping students grow academically.





Brief History

- Established in 1984 as Virginia's Electronic Classroom
- Expanded to become Virginia Satellite Educational Network (VSEN)
- Early 2000s: Virginia Virtual AP School (VVAPS) launched
- VSEN and VVAPS combined to form Virtual Virginia in 2006
- Complement to local school offerings
 - Priority on providing opportunities
 - Moving from fixed to flexible
- Full-time program launched in 2015–2016
- Sustained growth, especially as Virtual Virginia expanded gradelevel offerings
 - Enrollment/Performance Data: self-reported prior to 2021–2022
 - VVA now reports via MSC

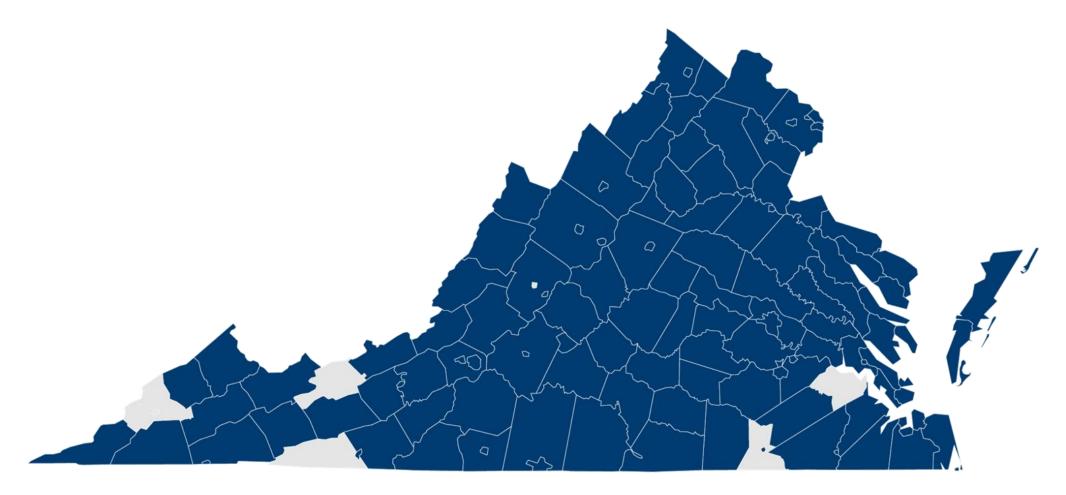

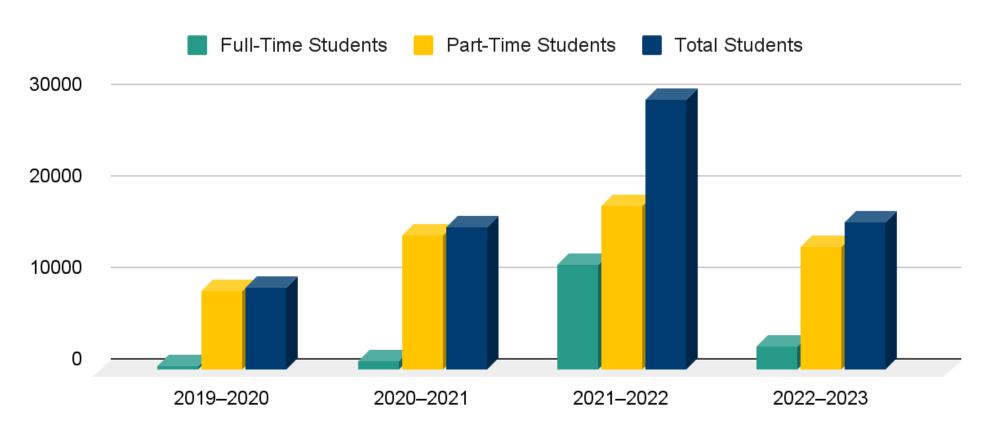


K-12 Instruction Participation, 2022-2023





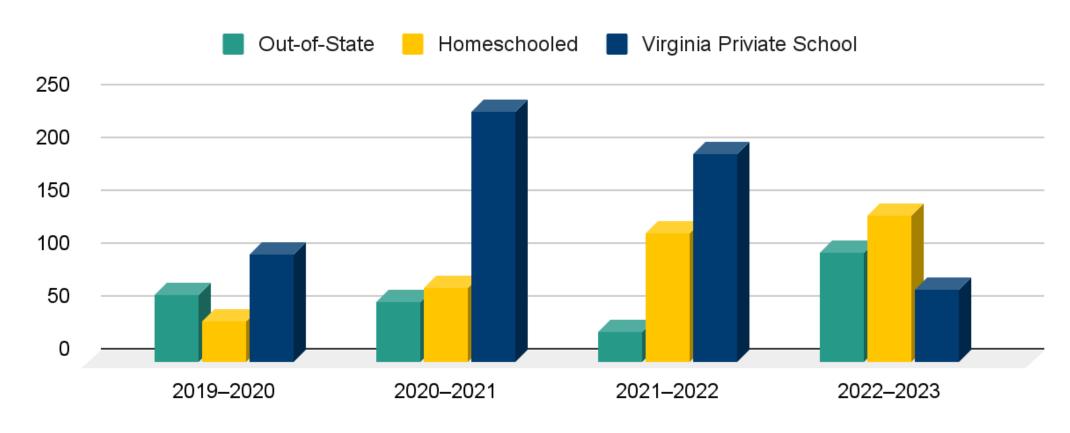
Part-Time & Full-Time Students, 2019–2023

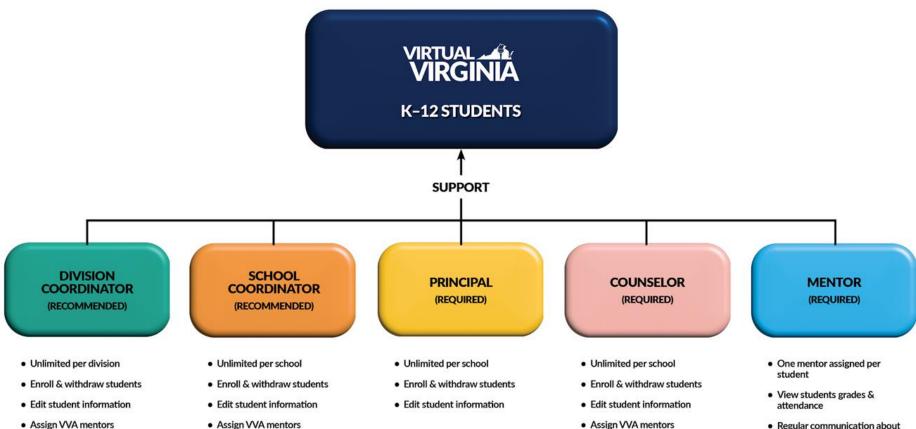

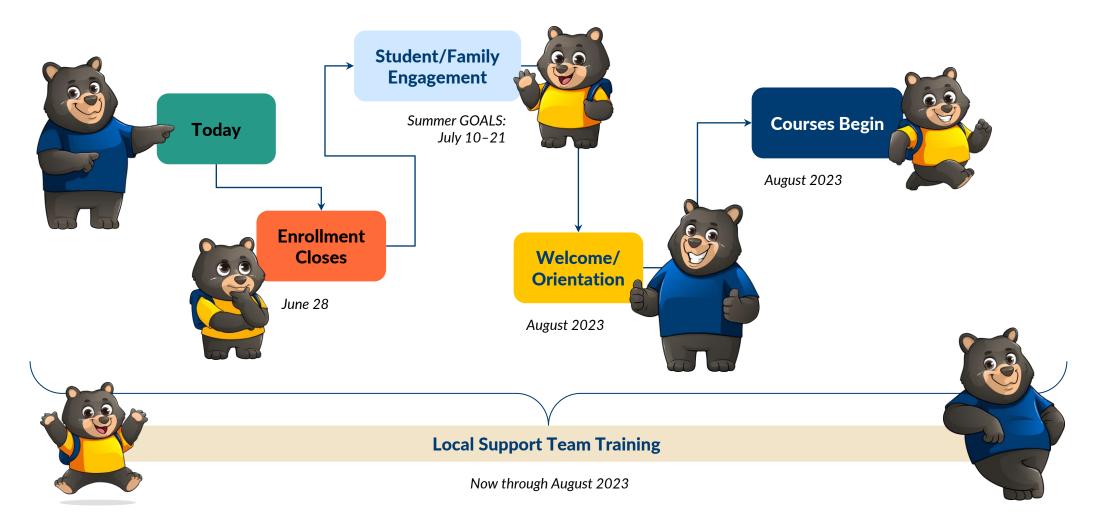

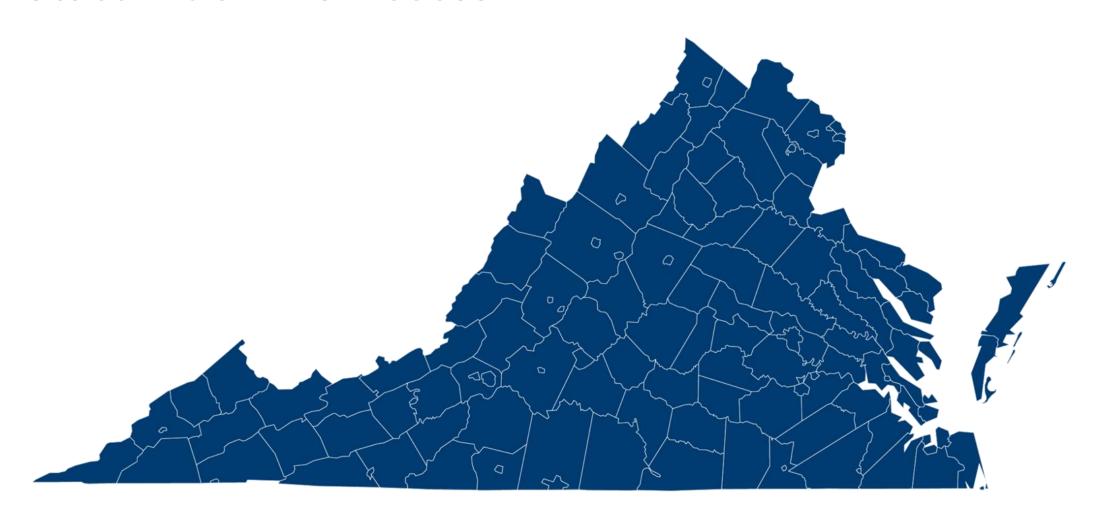

- Secondary students feel restricted by the filter, internet connectivity, and access to personal devices.
- Students want the freedom of personalized learning pathways and think learning on their own is the most important life skills.
- Students spend the most time on technology with looking up information, remediation, and assessments.
- Parents feel students are using too much technology in class and that it varies too much from teacher to teacher.
- Parents and Administrators feel students need to work on digital citizenship; however, students feel they are good digital citizens.
- Teachers reflected that the internet is inconsistent, and students have laptops that are not charged or damaged.
- Teachers like in person, hands on workshops.
- Teachers observed positive student outcomes when technology has been used effectively to support self directed, self paced learning
- Administrators and teacher feel they only have a basic knowledge of strategies/resources for leveraging technology for project based, student choice learning & teaching but want to learn more.
- Students, Parents, and Administrators all agree that having a job, volunteering, or internship is the best experience for preparing for the future.
- More than 50% of this years funding for infrastructure came from one time funds like CARES Act

EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY PLAN FOR VIRGINIA 2024-2029

- The current plan, which is housed in the comprehensive plan, expires this year.
- The Board of Education has approved the timeline for revision.
- A committee of advisors has been formed including parents, teachers, professors, business owners, exceptional education advocates, executive directors, and other specialist.
- We have solicited input from the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Education.

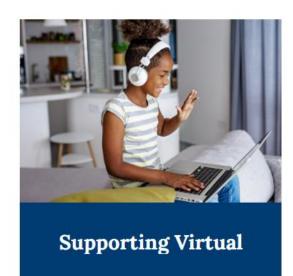

Role of Divisions

§ 22.1-299. License required of teachers; provisional licenses; exceptions.

A. No teacher shall be regularly employed by a school board or paid from public funds unless such teacher holds a license or provisional license issued by the Board.

In addition, under Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA), teachers must be properly licensed and endorsed for the classes they are assigned to teach.

Human resources and licensure staff work in coordination to ensure the teachers being hired will qualify for a license. The division also determines the teachers' course assignments and link them to SCED codes.

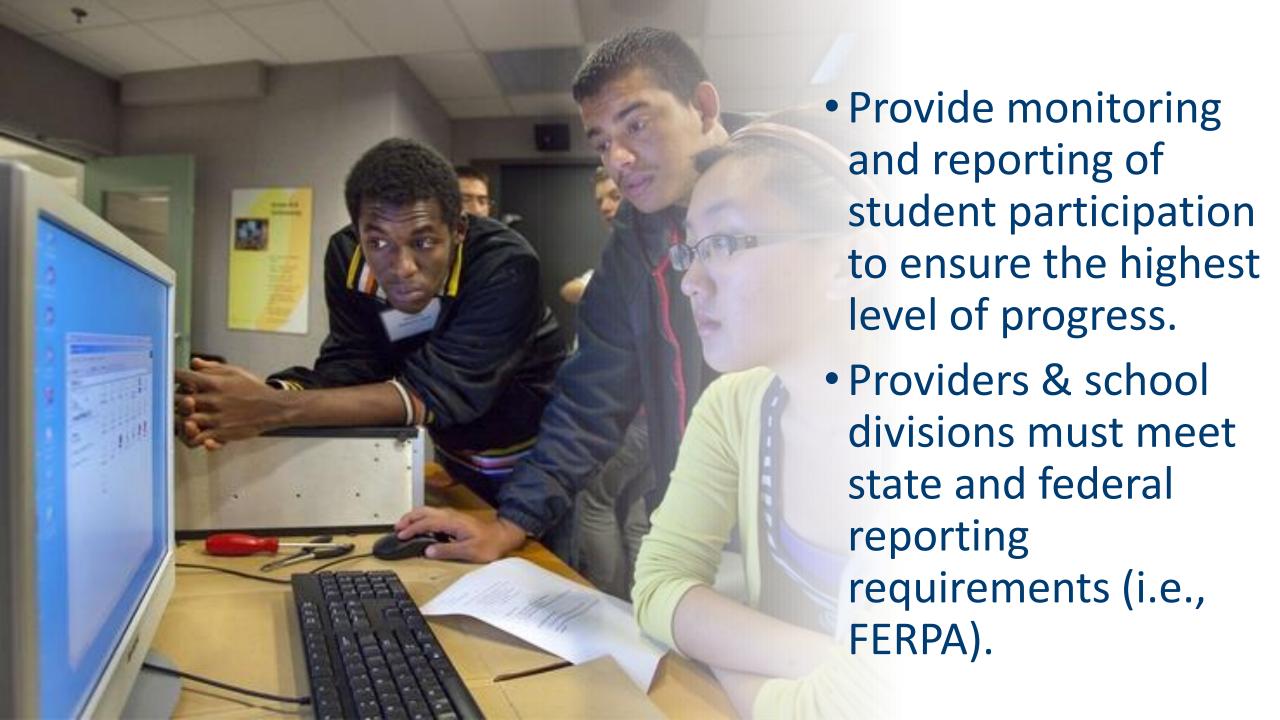
