## SUBJECT: The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) Cut Scores

The <u>ASVAB</u> is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. Effective 2014-2015 school year and beyond, upon successful completion of a Military Science program (Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) I, II, and/or III), students taking the ASVAB examination must meet the branch-specific cut score as identified in the chart below.

ASVAB scores are used primarily to determine <u>enlistment eligibility</u>, assign applicants to <u>military jobs</u>, and to aid students in <u>career exploration</u>. The "Overall" ASVAB Score is known as the Armed Forces Qualification Test Score (AFQT). Scores are computed using the standard scores from four ASVAB subtests: Arithmetic Reasoning (AR), Mathematics Knowledge (MK), Paragraph Comprehension (PC), and Word Knowledge (WK).

Additionally, students who are enrolled in a Military Science course and earn a passing score on the ASVAB exam may use this industry certification to satisfy the graduation requirement for the Standard Diploma. The Pass/Fail scores are submitted to the Virginia Department of Education via the Single Sign-On for Web Systems (SSWS) Career and Technical Education Credential Collection (CTECC), due by July 31, 2016.
