



What is the Student Detail by Question Report (SDBQ)?

The score report that results from completing a Virginia assessment is called the Student Detail by Question Report or SDBQ for short. Schools provide SDBQ Reports to families so please contact your child's school for access to these reports.

At the top of the page, you'll see information about your student, the **name of the test**, and your student's **vertical scaled score**. You might also see a **scaled score (0-600)** and a **performance level**.



The **vertical scaled score** shows a student's progress from one test to the next and tells us how close they are to being proficient (on grade level) or advancing to the next.



The scaled scores range from 0-600 and tell us if a student is failing, proficient or advanced.

0-399 for Fail/Basic

400-499 for Pass/Proficient (on grade level)

500-600 Pass/Advanced

Next, is a question-by-question description of everything covered on your student's test. The SDBQ report also gives you information about each question's difficulty level represented as high (H), medium (M) and low (L).

A 'check' means a question was answered correctly, and an 'x' shows it was answered incorrectly.
