## BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

#### OUR SHARED VISION

## We envision a Virginia where *all* children have the opportunity to enter school ready.

- All families have affordable access to and support to choose the option that meets their unique needs.
- All early childhood programs that take public funds benefit from measurement and supports for improvement, ensuring quality choices are available for all families.
- Programs are rewarded for continual improvement and educators are adequately compensated.
- Overall Virginia's early childhood system is unified, data-driven and resource-effective so families can work, go to school or pursue employment and children have every opportunity to be successful.



Four out of ten Virginia children enter school without the key literacy, math, and social-emotional skills needed. (VKRP\_fall 2022)



#### SCHOOL READINESS IN VIRGINIA




of Virginia's kindergarteners began the 2022-2023 school year still needing to build skills in Literacy, Mathematics, Self-Regulation, and/or Social Skills.\*



#### PERSISTENT DISPARITIES IN READINESS

Students who have historically faced barriers are less likely to enter kindergarten with the skills needed to succeed.



#### VQB5 THEORY OF CHANGE

Virginia's early childhood system must ensure that <u>all</u> children have access to quality teaching and learning experiences that meet their unique needs.

#### Working together, through VQB5, we will:

**UNIFY** around shared and equitable expectations for quality.

MEASURE and strengthen teacher-child interactions and curriculum use in all publicly-funded birth-to-five programs.

improve supports for educators, prioritizing those who need it most.

# VQB5 CURRICULUM USE AND EXPECTATIONS FOR SITES

## MEASURING QUALITY IN VQB5

VQB5 measures the quality of infant, toddler, and preschool teaching and learning based on two nationally-recognized quality indicators.

Interactions	Curriculum
Measure teacher-child interactions and instruction in a developmentally-appropriate way using the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) <sup>TM</sup> .	Measure the use of approved curricula that are aligned with Virginia's Early Learning and Development Standards.

Research shows that stimulating and supportive interactions between teachers and children and effective use of quality curricula promote children's holistic learning and development, *resulting in improved school readiness*.

#### VQB5 QUALITY RATINGS

VQB5 Quality Ratings are calculated at the end of the program year using the following point system.

Interactions Points (700 total points)	Average of all local CLASS scores from the fall and the spring (all classrooms at a site) x 100*		
Curriculum Points (100 total points)	Programs using an approved curriculum in at least one classroom, by May 31st, will receive 100 points added to their score		
<b>Total Points</b>	Interactions Points + Curriculum Points = Total Points		
Quality Ratings	<ul> <li>Exceeds Expectations = 700 - 800 points</li> <li>Meets Expectations = 400 - 699 points</li> <li>Needs Support = 100 - 399 points</li> </ul>		

<sup>\*</sup>If there are significant discrepancies between comparable local and external scores, a score replacement protocol will be used when calculating the interaction points for the total as outlined in Section 6.2.1 in the VQB5 Guidelines.

# CURRICULUM SUPPORTS QUALITY INTERACTIONS AND IMPROVEMENT


Curriculum consists of the "plans for the learning experiences through which all children acquire knowledge, skills, abilities, and understanding."

#### Curriculum helps teachers provide quality interactions by:

- Defining specific, sequenced learning goals to meet all children's individual needs
- Providing structure, routines
- Suggesting activities that promote all children's engagement
- Offering scripts to help teachers scaffold all children's learning (i.e., how to explain concepts)
- Promoting consistency across all classrooms

**Professional Development materials** that accompany quality curriculum support educational leaders, trainers, and coaches to engage with teachers on ways to improve interactions and promote learning.


#### PY2 CURRICULUM USE IN CLASSROOMS FALL


#### PY2 CURRICULUM USE IN CLASSROOMS SPRING





TEACHERS IMPROVE THEIR
INTERACTIONS

The choice to use an approved curriculum in at least one classroom results in some additional points towards the VQB5 Quality Rating. However, this is not required for participation or required for receiving a rating that meets expectations.\*

Programs that are interested in using an approved curriculum as part of VQB5 may:

- 1) Use one of the 60+ approved early childhood curriculum available <u>or</u>
- 2) Request to have their curriculum of choice reviewed for possible approval.

Sites can update curriculum use information in LinkB5 classroom profiles through May 31<sup>st</sup>.

# BASELINE CRITERIA FOR HIGH QUALITY CURRICULUM

- Fully aligned to Virginia's Early Learning and Development Standards (ELDS)
- Comprehensive and integrated
- Does not include copyrighted materials
- Research-based
- Inclusive resources
- Specific details about how instruction should be individualized based on the interests, strengths, and needs of all children

#### VQB5 Curriculum Frequently Asked Questions

The following talking points are intended to address frequently asked questions and concerns regarding the Curriculum component of VQB5. More information is available in the <u>VQB5 Guidelines</u>.

#### **Curriculum Reminders**

- Use of an approved curriculum in VQB5 is optional. There is no VQB5 curriculum requirement.
  - o Programs can participate and meet expectations without having an approved curriculum.
  - Programs using an approved curriculum in at least one classroom will receive 100
    points towards their overall quality score, with the goal of strengthening the
    implementation of curricular materials and content in future years.
- All birth to five early childhood educators benefit from access to and support to use quality curriculum to promote children's learning and development.
  - A curriculum component was added to VQB5 because curriculum is a nationally recognized quality indicator. Programs that choose to use an approved curriculum in at least one classroom will receive 100 points.
- VDOE-approved curricula are comprehensive and aligned to the VA-ELDS among other baseline criteria for quality early childhood curriculum.
  - Curriculum that is aligned to <u>Virginia's Early Learning and Development Standards</u>: <u>Birth-Five Learning Guidelines</u> ensures children have the opportunity to access the content and skills that are outlined in the standards.
  - A high-quality, comprehensive curriculum will include resources and provide guidance on

#### CURRICULUM "GET TO KNOW YOU" SERIES

In order to provide continued curriculum support and assist Virginia Early Childhood providers with informed decision-making, VDOE will host a second round of the "Get to Know You" Lunch & Learn virtual series featuring representatives from Virginia-approved curriculum vendors.

- Special sessions will be held for Family Day Home and Spanish-speaking providers.

# VQB5'S CURRICULUM REVIEW PROCESS

#### ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Role	Responsibilities
Provider	Initiate the review process by submitting a complete request.
VDOE	<ul> <li>Communication with provider.</li> <li>Communication with developer.</li> <li>Communication with consultant.</li> <li>Review and approve consultant timesheets.</li> </ul>
Developer	<ul> <li>Respond to VDOE's RFA by deadline.</li> <li>Submit complete package.</li> <li>Communicate directly with VDOE.</li> </ul>
Consultant	<ul> <li>Complete review by deadline.</li> <li>Communicate directly with VDOE.</li> <li>Complete a quality assurance check annually.</li> </ul>

## VQB5'S CURRICULUM REVIEW PROCESS







The curriculum is reviewed for baseline criteria using the <u>presubmission checklist</u>.

The curriculum and materials undergo a thorough review by a curriculum expert.

A curriculum approval decision is made, and the list is updated.

The estimated timeline for a full curriculum review is approximately 3 months.

Pending Curriculum Vendors will receive a 60-day notice to submit materials in order to be included for this VQB5 year. Communication will go out to providers using the pending curriculum, alerting them to its pending status for this VQB5 year.
