#### **Overview**

This discussion guide is based on the Chronic Absenteeism Task Force Meeting Two from Tuesday, November 7. This guide builds on the <u>video</u>, <u>Powerpoint</u>, and additional resources linked within this document to help school division teams discuss their current parent engagement strategies and consider additional components that complement the hard work of the school division's attendance team.

Below are a set of questions to guide the team's discussion and planning for family engagement.

#### **Grounding Discussion Questions:**

- How does the team connect with families and establish the importance of attendance?
- Has the school division provided supports to help ALL families determine when a student should stay home or go to school?
- What other strategies may help all families provide effective routines for daily attendance?

**Take Action:** What are ideas or handouts (eg. Healthy Guidance) might help inform families of the importance of attendance? Are there existing school family nights that may lend themselves to activities to engage families in understanding the impact of chronic absenteeism?

#### **Grounding Discussion Questions:**

• As the school division attendance team develops a comprehensive family engagement strategy, how will the team determine criteria for tier two and tier three students?

- As the team considers families who are struggling with routines that promote daily attendance, what
  are strategies that the team could use to support students who are starting to demonstrate chronic
  absenteeism?
- How has the team considered personalized strategies such as the door hanger shared by Colonial Heights on the meeting video?
- How is the team helping families track their child's attendance and understand how attendance patterns are impacting their child's learning?
- What other strategies in the attendance toolkit may be helpful to support students with intensive needs?

**Take Action:** As the team develops a comprehensive family engagement plan, what relationship building strategies are highlights in some schools? How can the team spread these strategies throughout the school division? What are new strategies that can be piloted and spread to support strong family relationships and engagement?
