# College Partnership Laboratory School Standing Committee Meeting Draft Minutes

## B. First Review of College Partnership Laboratory School Application from James Madison University

Dr. Andy Armstrong, Assistant Superintendent of Strategic Innovation, presented this item to the Standing Committee. Representatives from James Madison University were in attendance to present and respond to questions from the Committee.

The Applicants responded very well to initial feedback and coaching provided by the VDOE SME team, and provided additional information as requested. The Applicants have options for students including dual enrollment options with a sustainable governance structure, including a sustainable financial model for the operation of the lab school program.

After thorough review, the Committee opted to take this item for first and final review. Mr. Hansen made a motion to approve the College Partnership Laboratory School Application from James Madison University, as presented. The motion was properly seconded and carried unanimously. Ms. Wodiska requested that the VDOE post the application for a ten-day public comment period and forward the application to the Board of Education in accordance with the Standing Committee's procedures.

## C. First Review of College Partnership Laboratory School Application from Mountain Gateway Community College

Dr. Andy Armstrong, Assistant Superintendent of Strategic Innovation, presented this item to the Standing Committee. Representatives from Mountain Gateway Community College were in attendance to respond to questions from the Committee. Mountain Gateway Community College presented the concept of a lab school designed collaboratively with multiple local school divisions to provide a comprehensive education toward practical skills required for meaningful IT careers.

The motion was properly seconded and carried unanimously. Ms. Wodiska requested that the VDOE post the application for a ten-day public comment period in accordance with the Standing Committee's procedures.
