## SUBJECT: 2014 Watershed Agreement - Seeking Environmental Literacy Management **Strategy Comments**

Governor Terry McAuliffe signed the 2014 Chesapeake Bay Watershed Agreement in June, a reaffirmed message that watershed education, a critical element of science and environmental literacy, is essential for all students regardless of where they live in the Commonwealth. Though the Agreement focuses on multiple management strategies concerning the Chesapeake Bay and its resources, the management strategies for the education goal are considered to have statewide application. Virginia will be making an expanded effort around the three outcomes of the education goal.

The Bay Program's Goal Implementation Teams have been crafting "management strategies" that describe the steps necessary to achieve the Agreement's Vision including education outcomes for science and environmental education. These management strategies offer insight into the Bay Program partners' proposals for reaching each outcome by 2025. The strategies provide broad, overarching direction and will be further supported by two-year work plans summarizing the specific commitments, short-term actions, and resources required for success.

Public input is essential to creating management strategies that are meaningful and effective. The draft management strategies are open for public input now through April 30, 2015. The Environmental Literacy Outcomes Management Strategy may be found at
