Question from H. McCartney: I'd like to talk more about the liquid soap change I'm having trouble documenting the reasoning behind the change.

VDOE response: Standards were revised in general based on updated industry practice, health and safety standards, and expert opinions from agency partners and child care practitioners. The intent of handwashing standards is to ensure infection control. Standards are aligned with national standards for handwashing and are closely aligned with Caring for Our Children.

Question from H. McCartney: Yes I've read through those links but will there be any accommodations allowed for children who might need to use bar soap if there is not any wiggle room here? Thanks

VDOE response: The standards allow for special accommodations that are documented in the child's record (8VAC20-781-50 B.5). However, if the center would like to request that bar soap be used throughout the program, an allowable variance may be requested.

Comment from H. McCartney: I would like to suggest that bar or liquid soap be allowed based on the National Institutes of Health link here:

I realize this is an older document. Perhaps there is more recent research available. There is also possible contamination from refillable containers as evidenced in this 2011 article. https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/21421792/

VDOE comment: For clarification, curriculum training and CLASS training falls under 'child development'.

Question from B. Nelson: Would child's development and needs be inclusive enough?

VDOE comment: Regarding infant equipment-current standards do not provide a time limit for the use of restrictive infant equipment. The revised standard increases the health and safety of infants by adding a limit to the time infants may be in restrictive equipment.
