## **SUBJECT: School Efficiency Review Program – Matrix of Best Practices and Common Recommendations**

The School Efficiency Review program, managed by the Virginia Department of Planning and Budget (DPB), is designed to identify ways that school divisions can realize cost savings in non-instructional areas so that resources can be redirected to classroom activities. Over 40 school divisions have undergone efficiency reviews through the program since 2004.
