SUBJECT: Public Notice: Regulatory Action Published in the Virginia Register of Regulations – Proposed Procedure for Adjusting Grievances

The Department of Education, on behalf of the Board of Education, announces a regulatory action published in the current issue of the *Virginia Register of Regulations*. The link to the announcement is as follows: 8VAC20-90 Procedure for Adjusting Grievances (Proposed Regulation).

On February 27, 2014, the Board of Education approved proposed amendments to the *Procedure for Adjusting Grievances*. The proposed amendments conform the regulation to changes in the *Code of Virginia* enacted by Chapters 588 and 650 of the 2013 Acts of Assembly and Chapters 13 and 103 of the 2014 Acts of Assembly and make other technical and clarifying changes. The proposed amendments (i) remove a teacher's option to have a grievance heard before a fact-finding panel, (ii) permit a local school board to designate an impartial hearing officer from outside the school division to hear a teacher's grievance, (iii) eliminate probation as a form of discipline, and (iv) reduce the time in which a teacher who received a notice of dismissal has to request a hearing to 10 days.

The proposed regulations were published in the <u>Virginia Register of Regulations VOL. 32 ISS. 7</u>, November 30, 2015. A public hearing on the proposed regulations will be held Thursday, January 28, 2016, in the 22nd Floor Jefferson Meeting Conference Room, James Monroe Building (101 North 14th Street, Richmond, Virginia 23219). The public hearing will begin immediately following adjournment of the Board of Education business meeting. Speakers will be asked to limit their comments to three minutes. Written copies of comments are appreciated, but not required.
