SUBJECT: Schools To Watch Program

Since 2003, Virginia has been one of the 19 state members of the *Schools To Watch Program*. Sponsored by the National Forum to Accelerate Middle Grades Reform, the goal of *Schools To Watch* is to identify and recognize outstanding middle schools based on four criteria:

- academic excellence;
- developmental responsiveness;
- social equity; and
- organizational structure.

The Virginia Department of Education is pleased to announce the names of four new and six redesignated Virginia middle schools that have been added to the list of *Schools To Watch*. The news schools are:

- Lake Ridge Middle School, Prince William County public schools;
- Harmony Middle School, Loudoun County public schools;
- Northside Middle School, Roanoke County public schools; and
- Wallace Middle School, Washington County public schools.

The redesignated schools are:

- Bull Run Middle School, Gainesville Middle School, Philip Michael Pennington School, Stonewall Middle School, Prince William County public schools; and
- Stone Hill Middle School and Blue Ridge Middle School, Loudoun County public schools.

These schools join the ranks of nearly 400 middle schools across the country considered to be important resources for other schools to consult in their efforts to continuously improve programs for middle grades students.

All middle schools across the Commonwealth are invited to apply to be a *School To Watch*.
