SUBJECT: Training on Accommodations for Limited English Proficient Students

As part of the Virginia Department of Education's ongoing effort to ensure that appropriate accommodations are provided to Limited English Proficient (LEP) students taking the Standards of Learning (SOL) assessments, training on the provision of accommodations to LEP students will be offered in four locations. This training will repeat training that has been offered across the Commonwealth in 2012 and 2013.

Participants in this training will gain a thorough understanding of:

- Accommodations available to LEP students for SOL assessments;
- The role of the LEP committee;
- LEP student characteristics;
- Evidence-based decision making when determining appropriate accommodations for LEP students for SOL assessments;
- The assignment of accommodations to LEP students for SOL assessments;
- The implementation of accommodations for LEP students for SOL assessments; and
- The documentation of accommodations provided to LEP students for SOL assessments.
