## SUBJECT: Using Classroom-Level Data to Improve the Achievement of English Language Learners (ELLs)

As part of the Virginia Department of Education's ongoing effort to ensure compliance with Section 3115 (c)(2) of the *Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965* (ESEA), seven one-day trainings titled, **Using Classroom-Level Data to Improve the Achievement of English Language Learners (ELLs)**, will be provided by World-Class Instructional Design and Assessment (WIDA) trainers to educators of English Language Learners (ELLs). It is <u>strongly recommended</u> that participating divisions send a two-member team consisting of an ESL teacher and a content teacher. Divisions that were in Title III improvement during the 2013-2014 school year are <u>highly encouraged</u> to participate in this training opportunity.

The one-day trainings are designed to assist teachers in analyzing classroom-level data from a language perspective to make instructional decisions that will assist ELLs in accessing classroom content in a meaningful way. Participants will be introduced to a data analysis process that can be applied to their own classroom data. After attending the workshop, participants will be able to:

- Describe the connection between the English Language Development (ELD) Standards Framework and classroom data;
- Identify patterns and trends from various data sets (i.e., unit/lesson plans and related materials, student work, and gradebooks); and
- Synthesize key findings from data to inform classroom practices.
