SUBJECT: Virginia Leads - Community of Practice Opportunities for Superintendents

and Aspiring Leaders

As part of Virginia's American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ARP ESSER) funding, the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) has awarded a grant to the College of William & Mary to assist with the recruitment and retention of school division superintendents. Through a collaborative partnership between VDOE, the Virginia Association of School Superintendents (VASS), the Commonwealth Learning Partnership, and the College of William & Mary, Virginia Leads is designed as a one-year grant initiative to retain current public school division superintendents and develop future "inspiring" educational leaders to become division superintendents.

Through this grant, VASS is leading and facilitating several **communities of practice for superintendents** through the **Superintendent Success Initiative**. Personalized professional learning opportunities for superintendents include:

- Cognia Leadership Circles: All VASS members will be registered to access personalized professional learning and support at a national level (i.e., Solutions Circles, Weekly Leader Chats, Online Leadership Community, Think Tank, and In-person Events).
- **Regional Learning Communities:** The eight superintendent study groups will be supported in regional and relevant professional learning.

• Seminars: VASS members will be provided the opportunities to participate in two seminars during 2022-23; (1) School Board, Community, and Superintendent Relationships and (2) Student Learning Loss.

Superintendents will receive further information regarding the **Superintendent Success Initiative** from VASS.

The Commonwealth Learning Partnership is leading and facilitating the community of practice for those who intend to pursue future leadership roles, including the superintendency. Participants will work in teams to develop their capacities for leading innovative practices using the collaborative network structure, the Virginia Leads Innovation Network (VaLIN) 4.0.

 A cohort of 30 teams, committed to advancing their leadership careers, will be selected to acquire the competencies defined by the Profile of a Virginia Graduate, the Profile of a Virginia Education Leader, and the Professional Standards for Education Leaders (PSEL).

The VaLIN 4.0 application window is June 10-29, 2022. More information on the application process and fee structure can be found on the Commonwealth Learning Partnership website.
